Quick Start User Manual – Version 7 – Public Browser

CollectionSpace is a web-based, open-source collections information management system. From cataloging and loans to inventory and digital asset management, CollectionSpace is used to manage many of the day-to-day activities of museum collections professionals and others who work with art, artifacts, objects, and specimens.

This manual provides a quick overview of the public browser of the CollectionSpace application.

Downloading and Installing

The CollectionSpace Public Browser is a JavaScript application that plugs into a museum's existing content management systems, e.g. WordPress, Drupal, etc.

Instructions on how to download and install the plug-in for your specific content management system can be found on the CollectionSpace GitHub page. Installation of the plug-in can be done by someone with administrative privileges for the content management system. It does not require a high level of technical knowhow, just a willingness to follow directions.

Public Browser User Account


To enable the public browser, you need to create a read-only user account. The user account and password should be assigned the TENANT_READER role, and follow the format:

Login: gateway@YOURCSPACEURL, e.g. gateway@core.collectionspace.org Password: gateway4u

- Thumbnail images (or placeholder text) for all published Objects •
- Keyword search (^QSearch collection) •
- Faceted browse (Refine results) •
- Object detail page •

To publish an Object to the Public Browser, select the value CollectionSpace Public Browser from the Publish To fields in the Object Identification section of the Object Cataloging record.

A complete list of all fields available on the public browser can be found on the <u>program wiki</u>, these fields vary slightly depending on which profile of CollectionSpace you are using (e.g. fine art, anthropology, etc.), but all profiles include the fields below. All fields may be search via keyword search, fields with an * are included in the faceted browse interface.

Publishing Media Records

To publish a Media Handling record to the Public Browser, select the value CollectionSpace Public Browser from the Publish To fields in the Media Handling Information section of the Object Cataloging record. Only Media Handling records related to Objects with a Publish To value of CollectionSpace Public Browser will appear on the Public Browser. You may publish as many related Media Handling records as you like. Note that only images will appear on the Public Browser, other file types will just appear as their file extension (just as they do in the CollectionSpace staff interface).

Publishing Exhibition Records

To publish an Exhibition record to the Public Browser, select the value CollectionSpace Public Browser from the Publish To fields in the Exhibition Information section of the Exhibition record. Only Exhibition records related to Objects with a Publish To value of CollectionSpace Public Browser will appear on the Public Browser.

Only select fields will be made available to the public. A complete list of all fields available on the public browser can be found on the <u>program wiki</u>; the fields appearing in the Exhibition section of the Object Detail records are below. All fields may be search via keyword search, only the Exhibition title is included in the faceted browse interface.

Objects may be related to multiple Exhibition records, but if an Object is related to more than one Published Exhibition record, **only data from one related Exhibition record will appear in the Public Browser**. The information in the three fields on the Object record does not change if the related Exhibition changes.
